### First Quarterly report published

In April, NPaCA published its first quarterly report, which provides an overview of the quality of key data items captured in the rapid cancer registration data for people diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in England between 1st October 2022 and 30th September 2023, for NHS Trusts and Cancer Alliances. A high-level summary of patient characteristics is also provided at NHS trust and Cancer Alliance levels.

The report highlights to Trusts where data submissions to the Cancer Outcomes and Services Dataset (COSD) could be improved to enable better reporting on performance indicators in the future.

We encourage all provider teams to review their data completeness and make improvements as required. View the first quarterly report <u>here</u>.
