#### **April Quarterly Report - interactive data dashboard**



The next NOCA quarterly report will be published on the **NATCAN website** on 10th April 2025, subject to clearance and sign-off. This report includes more recent data, patients in England diagnosed up to September 2023. This report is now in the format of an interactive data dashboard, allowing trusts to view provider-level results online. From July 2025, the dashboard will include additional features, and we have begun a period of consultation with our stakeholders, including clinicians, NHS England and patients, so that we can provide as useful a tool as possible to aid local quality improvement. # NICE ovarian cancer quality standard update published

NICE has just published the <u>updated quality</u> standard on ovarian cancer, QS18. The standard describes high-quality care in priority areas for improvement. The lead methodologist for the NOCA, Professor Jan van der Meulen, joined the <u>NICE quality standard committee (QSAC)</u> to provide expertise on measurement, including referencing relevant measures in the audit.
