
July Quarterly Report published

The most recent NAoMe Quarterly Report was published on 10th July 2025 and includes cancer alliance and individual trust-level data on:

- Two performance indicators: (1) % of people who were discussed at a multi-disciplinary team meeting (MDT) and (2) % of people dying within 30 days of a cycle of systemic anti-cancer therapy (usually chemotherapy).
- Five data completeness indicators
- Downloadable reports.
- A patient Guide to NAoMe Quarterly Reports.

Data Quality Working Group

We have established a NAoMe Data Quality Working Group with members of our Audit Advisory Committee and key stakeholders.

The group first met in April 2025 to discuss the data challenges faced by the audit. We heard from Karen Graham, Head of the Data Improvement Team for the National Disease Registration Service (NDRS), about the capture of breast cancer recurrence in the Cancer Outcomes and Services Dataset (COSD) and from Gurdeep Mannu from Oxford University about their recurrence algorithm.



The next meeting will be scheduled for Autumn 2025.
