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

State of the Nation Report 2025


The second **NKCA State of the Nation report** was published on Thursday 11th September 2025. More information is available on our **new website**.

Report includes results for eight performance indicators for people diagnosed with kidney cancer between January 2018 and December 2022 in England, and January 2022 to December 2023 in Wales. It also describes the national picture and variation between NHS trusts in England from January 2019 to September 2024 and health boards in Wales in 2022-2023.



This year, results for individual organisations are available on our **data dashboard**. We encourage kidney cancer service providers to review the findings of this report and their results on the dashboard to explore reasons for unwarranted variations in practice.

The report outlines five recommendations to support improvements in the quality of kidney cancer care. One of the key recommendations is:



"Ensure people diagnosed with metastatic RCC are evaluated by a medical/clinical oncologist with expertise in renal cancer management to increase the proportion of people considered for receipt of systemic anti-cancer therapy (SACT) if appropriate."
