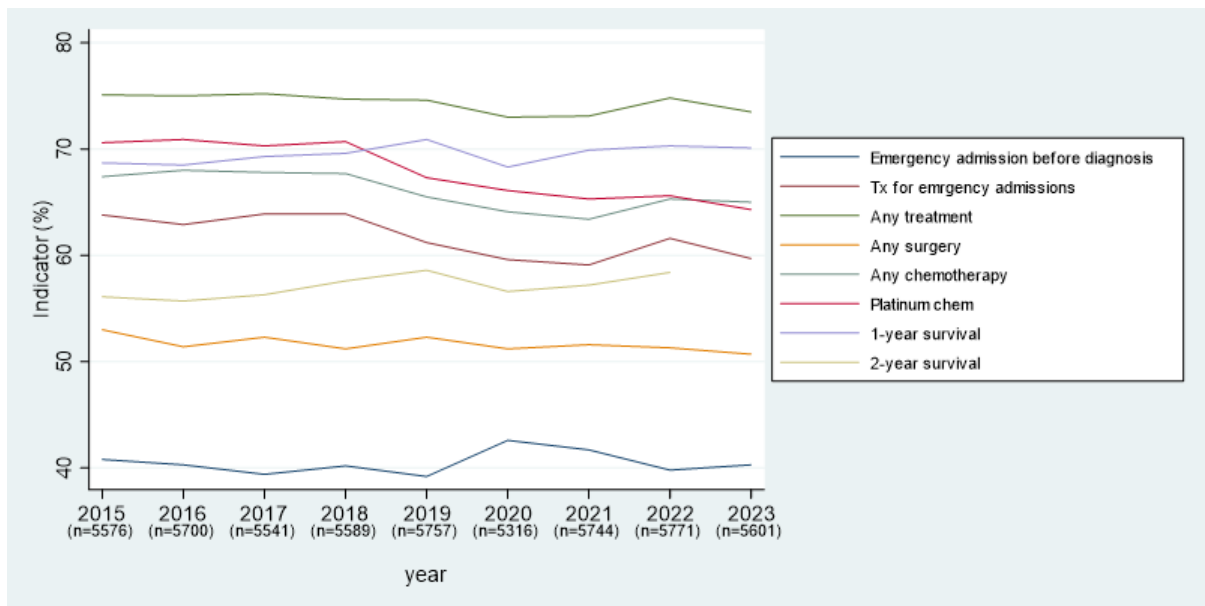


Figure 1. Time trends of NOCA performance indicators for women diagnosed with ovarian cancer in England between 2015-2023



This graph, using longitudinal data, shows improvement in survival rates between 2015 and 2023. At a national level, ovarian cancer care has largely compensated for disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic across most indicators, particularly in survival. However, there has been a reduction in the rates of chemotherapy receipt for all women and in treatment rates for women diagnosed following an emergency admission. This decline is concerning and requires further investigation as it may risk reversing the survival gains achieved in recent years.
